## Frequently asked questions about St. Joseph's Hospital Perinatal program move to LHSC

### When is the St. Joseph's perinatal program moving to LHSC, Victoria Hospital?

All perinatal program services currently located at St. Joseph's Health Care, London, including the tertiary care obstetrical and neonatal intensive care units, begin moving to Victoria Hospital, LHSC on Saturday, June 4, 2011.

### Can I refer perinatal patients to St. Joseph's Hospital up to June 4?

Yes. Until June 4, 2011, the perinatal program at St. Joseph's Hospital continues to be the high risk obstetrical facility in London and the site of the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU). Patients requiring the services of St. Joseph's should continue to be referred there. Low risk or moderate risk patients in London should continue to be referred to either LHSC or St. Joseph's Hospital.

### Will patients referred to physicians at St. Joseph's Hospital have to change physicians when the program moves to LHSC?

No. Perinatal physicians at St. Joseph's Hospital will be moving to LHSC with the program. After June 4, any registered patient in labour, or those with pregnancy problems, will deliver and receive postnatal care at LHSC, by the same physician or physician team member to whom they were referred.

## LHSC's adult mental health care program is moving to Victoria Hospital next month

All adult acute mental health care services at LHSC will move from South Street Hospital to two locations at Victoria Hospital over a three-week period beginning Monday, April 11, 2011 and ending Friday, April 29, 2011.

All outpatient ambulatory care services including day treatment, prevention and early intervention on psychosis (PEPP) and psychogeriatrics, are moving to zone A, level 2 at Victoria Hospital. Adult mental health care inpatients will be moving to zone B, level 7 at Victoria Hospital. Please see the mental health care program move schedule below for the specific move dates.

**PLEASE NOTE:** There are no changes to the current referral processes and all phone and fax numbers for the program will remain the same.

More specific information about any planned service reductions and/or modifications during the move period will be provided to you in our next issue of Bulletin.

## Recently moved...

Below is a summary of programs that have recently moved.

Program	New Location
<b>Paediatric inpatient unit</b> LHSC	<b>Zone B, level 6 – Victoria Hospital</b> Children’s Hospital’s paediatric inpatient unit has moved within Victoria Hospital to a brand new space in zone B, level 6. Please note that only the paediatric inpatient unit has moved. The Children’s emergency department, paediatric critical care unit and paediatric medical day unit remain in their current locations at this time. This move has no external implications.
<b>Victoria Hospital inpatient gynecology and mother baby/antenatal care units</b> LHSC	<b>Zone D, level 7 – Victoria Hospital</b> Beds allocated to gynecology and mother baby/antenatal care were temporarily relocated within Victoria Hospital to allow for the refurbishment of level 4 in zones C and D. The birthing centre on level 2 has not moved. This move has no external implications as patients in these units will continue to enter the system by an initial referral to a specialist from their family physician, admittance to the birthing centre or through the closest emergency department.
<b>Child and Adolescent Mental Health Care</b> LHSC	<b>Zone B, level 8 - Victoria Hospital</b> All program services (inpatients, eating disorders, day treatment and outpatients) have moved from previous locations at Victoria and South Street Hospitals to zone B, level 8 at LHSC’s Victoria Hospital. Phone and fax numbers for this program remain the same and the referral process is also unchanged.

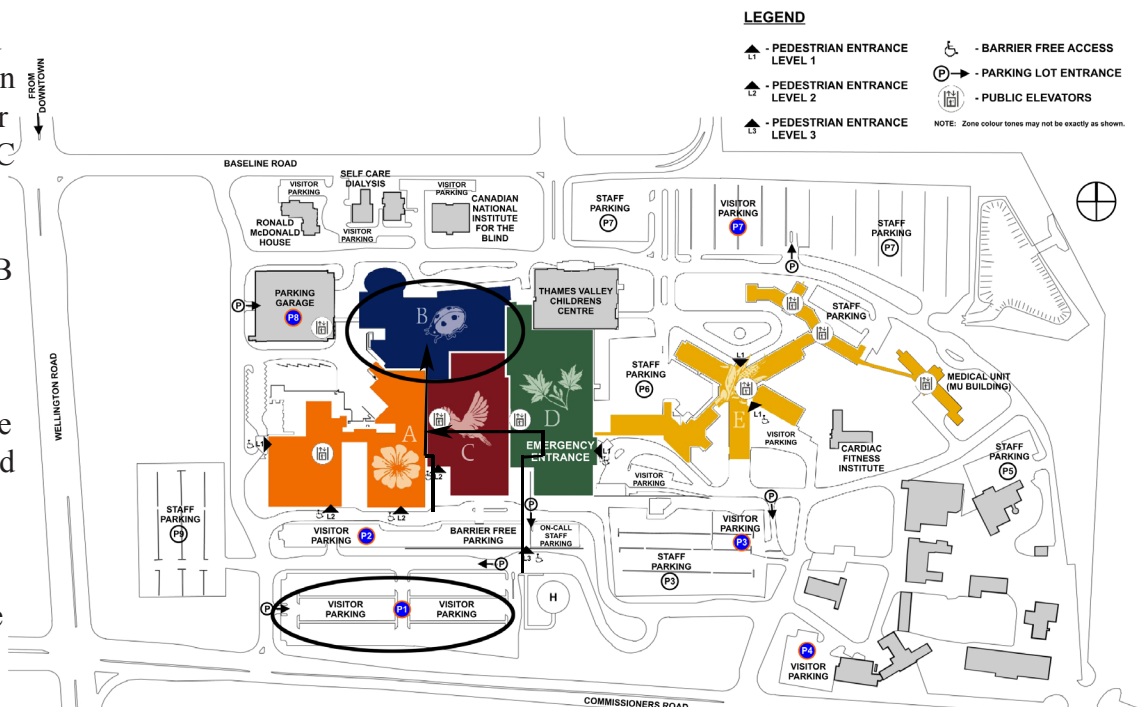

## LHSC - VICTORIA HOSPITAL CAMPUS MAP - Accessing zone B

To access zone B, patients and visitors should park in the main P1 visitor parking lot and enter the hospital through the main C entrance. You will be on level 2. From there, simply follow the ladybug signs to the zone B elevators.

Patients and visitors can also access zone B by entering zone D via the covered walkway and following the signage.

There will be direct access to zone B in June 2011, when the building is fully occupied.
