

## Delineation of Procedural Privileges Department of – Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation

Delineation	Privileges	Educational and Experience Requirements
<b>A</b>	All activities and procedures generally performed by physicians certified in the specialty.	Specialty Certification from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, or an Academic Certificate from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario.
<b>B</b>	<p>All activities and procedures generally performed by physicians certified in the specialty inclusive of Category A Delineation.</p> <p>Procedures requiring the use of specialized equipment and/or training as approved by the Chief of the Department including:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Electrodiagnostics</li> <li>2. Spinal and peripheral nerve diagnostics and therapeutic blocks</li> <li>3. Joint injections, including spinal and appendicular</li> <li>4. Acupuncture</li> </ol>	Certification and Fellowship as indicated in Category A Delineation, and additional training as defined and supported by the Chief of the Department.
<b>P</b>	Privileges granted to physicians not certified in the specialty who have experience, training and/or demonstrated competence.	<p>Family Medicine Training Program.</p> <p>College Canadian Family Practice.</p> <p>Fellowship from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada.</p>
