Delineation	Privileges	Educational and Experience Requirements
A	All activities and procedures generally performed by physicians certified in the specialty of Radiation Oncology or subspecialties of Haematology or Medical Oncology.	Specialty Certification and Fellowship from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, or an Academic Certificate of Registration from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario.
C	<p>All activities and procedures generally performed by physicians certified in the specialty inclusive of Category A Delineation.</p> <p>Procedures requiring the use of specialized equipment and/or training as approved by the Chief of the Department.</p> <p>For example, Associate Oncologists and General Practitioners. Oncologists and Practitioners in this category may: Provide the general medical care of a cancer patient including pain control or management of treatment related side effects.</p>	<p>Certification and Fellowship as indicated in Category A Delineation or Canadian College of Family Practice, and additional training as defined and supported by the Chief of the Department.</p> <p>Certified in Family Medicine (or equivalent), or Internal Medicine (or equivalent).</p>
CA	<p>Those in a clinical assistant role with Oncology: Only work under the direct supervision of a current ACTIVE Professional Staff member in Critical Care and may NOT be the most responsible physician; May write orders; May assist in the provision of on-call coverage.</p>	Hold a valid Independent Certificate of Registration or Restricted Certificate of Registrations with CPSO.
